Gov. Perdue Appoints Commissioners to the N.C. Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service

RALEIGH—Gov. Bev Perdue appointed 15 new commissioners and reappointed 10 commissioners to the North Carolina Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service.

“Gov. Perdue has appointed strong leaders from across North Carolina who support a new era of service in our state. With so many communities in need and nonprofits and government feeling the pinch of dwindling resources volunteerism and community service will have a monumental impact on helping North Carolina emerge from this recession as the best place in the world to live, work and raise a family,” said Kaye Gattis, executive director of the N.C. Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service. “These commissioners will strive to make service part of the daily life of every North Carolinian.”

The Commission has 25 members, each serving a three-year term. The Governor appoints all members.
